Call Meeting to Order and Introduction of New Members

- Laurie Feiler called the meeting to order and introduced the new council members: Rep. Haugaard, Sen. Youngberg, and Sen. Heinert.

Drug Trends – Bryan Gortmaker

- Bryan Gortmaker, Director of the Division of Criminal Investigation, presented several handouts and gave an explanation about the current status of drug trends across the state.

Key Takeaways

- State funding helps combat multiple drugs and not just methamphetamine.
- There is a 60-90 day statistical lag on data due to testing and other implementation processes.
- UA arrests are not counted in the meth handout. It is possession and not ingestion related.
- Meth arrests and total drug arrests are up from 2016 to 2017.
- Over \$1 million in fentanyl pills found.

Smart On Crime – Patrick Weber

-Patrick Weber, Governor’s Office, presented about the changes that came as a result of the Smart on Crime work group.

Key Takeaways

- Presumptive Probation changes:
 - A few more crimes have been made ineligible.
 - Mandatory sanction set for failed drug screening.
- Deferred Imposition of Sentence – new process created for drug crimes only.
 - Poss/Ingestion crimes and one time only.
 - If fully compliant on probation/parole, a felony is reduced to a misdemeanor.

Implementation Updates

DOC Update—Laurie Feiler

-Deputy Secretary Feiler reviewed the required reporting metrics from the Department of Corrections.

Key Takeaways

- Handouts given with updates on parole statistics including:
 - Parole population and compliance
 - Parole revocations and violations
 - State by state comparisons for technical parole violators
 - SD is located within one of the top two brackets for % of technical parole violators.

UJS Update-Troy Schmid

- Troy Schmid from the Unified Judicial System provided an overview of the dashboards and a walkthrough of several of the available dashboards to the council.

DSS Update-Amy Iversen-Pollreiz

- Deputy Secretary Amy Iversen-Pollreiz from the Department of Social Services provided an overview of the dashboard data available from DSS as well as a short summary on the latest service statistics.

SAVIN Update—Michelle Bland

-Michelle Bland from the Attorney General’s office provided an update about the SAVIN system.

Key Takeaways

- Marsey's Law updates are still ongoing and a joint effort is being made with DOC and UJS.
- Other states have been asking for demonstrations on SD’s SAVIN processes.
- There are currently 1,300+ registrants within the system.
